Even the teachers got in on the summer fun, posing for group shots in the lovely sunny weather and wishing their students the very best of luck for their exams and beyond!








The trip served as a welcome break from their exam revision, as well as a year of completing university applications and patiently waiting for the offer letters to begin pouring in!
