WELCOME TO KPS SUMMER


We are delighted that you are considering Kensington Park School's Academic Summer Courses, which offer students aged 14 to 17 a unique pre-university experience in the very heart of London.

Students will enjoy the peace and quiet of the local area while studying in the morning, before heading out into the hustle and bustle of the city in the afternoon.





COURSE STRUCTURE

Academic Pathway

At the core of our summer courses are pathway-specific workshops, lectures, and seminars, which are led by expert teachers and industry professionals. Our teaching is based on the principle 'learn, practice, produce'. We teach students the theoretical foundations, help them to apply these in practical contexts, and then give them space to create something of their own based on the skills they have learnt. At the end of the programme, students have the chance to present their projects to their peers during our student showcase.

Field Trips & Visits

Subject-specific field trips are a fundamental part of our student experience. Over the course of our summer programme, students will enjoy five afternoons of academic trips and visits with their subject teachers. These trips provide students with real-world examples of their subjects in action.

Life Skills

Alongside their subject classes, summer students benefit from practical workshops which focus on developing the skills that will help them to succeed at university and beyond. Interactive sessions in areas such as critical thinking, public speaking, interview skills, and growth mindset will push students out of their comfort zones and challenge them to develop new ways of thinking.

Social

A key part of KPS Summer is meeting new people from all over the world, and creating friendships that will last a lifetime. During the evenings and at the weekend, summer students enjoy a rich and varied social programme which will introduce them to the breadth of the UK's capital city.





On Sunday, students can choose to join a supervised excursion, heading down river to the leafy, picturesque borough of Greenwich with its famous market, fascinating history, and beautiful park featuring spectacular views of the city. Students also have the option of enjoying some free time where they can go shopping, visit one of London's many museums, or enjoy a stroll through one of its parks.

Evening Excursions

In their first week, students are introduced to the spectacular sights and attractions of London, with group excursions to key landmarks such as the London Eye, Big Ben, and the West End.

We understand that each student works on their own rhythm, and on some evenings, therefore, students have the option of heading out into the city, or staying at the boarding house to take part in a more relaxed social activity in the common room.

Towards the end of the first week, an element of free time is introduced into the timetable, during which students can go out and explore London independently with their friends.

Parents/guardians will be asked to confirm if they give consent for students to go out independently during free time during the enrolment process.

Boat Party

The programme ends with a private farewell boat cruise for all students along the River Thames. Students watch the sunset over London before dancing the night away with their friends under the stars – the perfect way to round off their summer school experience!

All students who book a transfer will be met at the airport by a representative and shown to their taxi to take them directly to the accommodation. There may be a short wait at the airport for another flight to come in.


All airport transfers are charged at £100 each way.

There will be a supplementary charge of £90 each way if you use an airlines' unaccompanied minors service.


